



Conflict Minerals Policy Statement

Filtermist International is committed to acting responsibly in all aspects of its operation.

In accordance with the USA's Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act of 2010, Filtermist International can confirm that it does not use any 'Conflict Minerals' in the products it manufactures in the UK.

The term Conflict Minerals refers to tantalum, tin, tungsten and gold mined in the Democratic Republic of Congo and neighbouring countries including Angola, Burundi, Central African Republic, the Republic of the Congo, Rwanda, South Sudan, Tanzania, Uganda and Zambia. Minerals sourced from these countries may have been mined in conditions of armed conflict and human rights abuses, and sold or traded by armed groups.

All suppliers of products manufactured on behalf of Filtermist are required to confirm that they do not use Conflict Minerals. If Conflict Minerals are 'necessary to the functionality or production of a product manufactured', suppliers are required to advise Filtermist of their adherence to Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act of 2010 throughout their own supply chains.
